Racial Justice Commission Resolution
Adopted October 4, 2022

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic disproportionately impacted BIPOC communities due to preexisting structural and institutional inequalities as a result of racism and disinvestment; and

WHEREAS, the Racial Justice Commission was formed to focus on racial justice and reconciliation with a mandate to identify and root out structural racism; and

WHEREAS, the Commission recommended three amendments to the City Charter that New Yorkers will vote on in the general election on November 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Commission's first proposal is a preamble to the City Charter that would guide city agencies and officials in carrying out their duties; and

WHEREAS, the Commission's second proposed amendment would establish a Racial Equity Office, plan, and commission to work with all city agencies to provide training and technical assistance on racial equity, and to assist city agencies to create racial equity plans; and

WHEREAS, the Commission's third proposed amendment would require New York City to create a true cost of living measure to track the actual cost of meeting essential needs without considering public, private, or informal assistance, in order to inform programmatic and policy decisions; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments promise to bring power, access, and opportunities to BIPOC New Yorkers and to create lasting capacity and accountability; now
