**RESOLUTION OF THE NEW YORK CITY CENTRAL LABOR COUNCIL, AFL-CIO, IN SOLIDARITY  
WITH THE COUNCIL OF SCHOOL SUPERVISORS AND ADMINISTRATORS DURING THEIR  
CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE CITY OF NEW YORK**

**Proposed: Thursday, November 21, 2019**

Whereas, the Council of School Supervisors and Administrators (CSA) represents over 6,000 Principals, Assistant Principals, Supervisors and Education Administrators who work in New York City's public schools; and

Whereas, CSA members have been serving their students, families, and communities without a contract with the City of New York since April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019; and

Whereas, CSA representatives have regularly engaged with the City of New York to deliver a fair contract that honors their members' immense contribution to NYC Schools; and

Whereas, the ability of the Department of Education (DOE) to deliver on their promise of "Equity and Excellence" and the success of many of the DOE's initiatives depend on the leadership, hard work, and talent of CSA's members;

Whereas, the working conditions of CSA's members affect their ability to provide the students of New York City with a safe learning environment and a well-rounded education of the highest quality; and

Whereas, awarding CSA members with a fair and equitable contract will help reaffirm the value of public education;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the New York City Central Labor Council, which represents over 300 unions and 1.3 million members throughout the City of New York, stands in solidarity with the CSA as it continues to negotiate with the City of New York; and

Be It Resolved, that the New York City Central Labor Council is calling upon the City of New York to bargain in good faith with CSA representatives; and

Be It Resolved, that the New York City Central Labor Council will encourage all member unions to support and stand in solidarity until it has delivered a fair and equitable contract to its members.
